

Washington County ARES Weekly Net Script

Repeater net control script

(Ver. 1.1 Revised 2017-08-20)

This is the script for the weekly Washington County ARES net that meets on the 147.045 W0ARC repeater at 7:30pm Central time or immediately following the Washington County Net, the latter of the two, followed by a simplex net on 146.415 for Washington County ARES members.

Any emergency traffic will be handled with top priority during this net. I will now break for any emergency traffic. Emergency traffic only, please call now.

If you need to pass emergency traffic at any time during this net, please notify Net Control and your traffic will be handled accordingly.

Net practices

This is a directed net. Please do not transmit acknowledged by Net Control. During the net, please direct all communications through Net Control, (callsign) _____ .

Please check out with Net Control if you should need to leave the net prior to closing.

This net is open to any licensed amateur radio operator that has an interest in amateur radio public service communications. This net is affiliated with the Amateur Radio Emergency Service of the American Radio Relay League; however ARES membership is not required to check in to the net this evening. ARES is not affiliated with any local club or group, and is under the direction of the ARRL appointed Emergency Coordinator. The EC for Washington County, Iowa is AB0DX. This is a training net, therefore, participating stations are encouraged to record the callsigns of all check-ins. In the event the NCS was to go off the air, you may need to serve as alternate NCS.

Please remember that if this repeater is not operational at the time of the net, this net will be held on 146.415 simplex.

Check-ins

We will accept check-ins in order of ARES affiliation. All stations will have an opportunity to check in; however, please wait for the appropriate check-in group. We will begin with ARES State Officers, then AECs, then stations on EchoLink, then Washington County ARES members, then all other ARES members, and finally general check-ins.

When called for check-in, please say "This is", (unkey) then unkey and listen. If you do not hear another station, continue your transmission providing:

- your call sign, first alphabetically then again with international phonetics,
- your name,
- your location,
- whether you have announcements or comments for the net,
- and, whether or not you plan to check into the Simplex Net following the close of this net.

We will now take check-ins from ARES State Officers. Please provide your title when checking in. ARES State Officers only, please call now.

(As stations check in, recognize them in groups of four, keeping a log of the call signs and names. Make note of anyone who has an announcement or comment.)

We will now take check-ins from Washington County Assistant Emergency Coordinators. Washington County ARES AECs only, please call now.

We will now take check-ins from stations on EchoLink. EchoLink stations only, please call now.

(Due to the nature of EchoLink connections, please allow sufficient time for the repeater carrier to drop. Only then will EchoLink stations be able to transmit.)

We will now take check-ins from Washington County ARES members. Washington County ARES members only, please call now.

We will now take check-ins from all ARES members. Please provide the county of your ARES membership when checking in. ARES members only, please call now.
